

# **Message of the Scientific Chair**

Welcome to the 21st Annual Meeting of the Sexual Medicine Society of North America (SMSNA) in fabulous Las Vegas! This meeting promises to build upon our history of stimulating and informative scientific programs.

The 21st Annual Fall Scientific Meeting of SMSNA has been designed to build on the strengths of prior meetings while simultaneously expanding our content to encompass the educational needs of our diverse membership. The days are long, and the schedule is full, but this is reflective of the nature of sexual medicine. It is our firm belief that this meeting will serve the needs of urologists, allied health practitioners, mental health experts, basic science and clinical researchers, trainees, and all other professionals interested in sexual health and wellness. We have enlisted the participation of top clinicians and researchers for the scientific program; we are confident that there will be something for everyone at this meeting.

The SMSNA continues to benefit from reciprocal relationships with organizations that share our commitment to sexual health. Our program will include special guest lectures by experts from the American Society for Men's Health (ASMH), the International Society for the Study of Women's Sexual Health (ISSWSH), the European Society for Sexual Medicine (ESSM) and the International Society for Sexual Medicine (ISSM).

The program is loosely organized into tracks so that all attendees will feel engaged throughout the meeting; while these tracks are a guide we are well aware that our diverse membership has diverse interests. We hope and believe that there will be ample opportunity for "cross pollination" at this meeting.

A select sampling of our program content is highlighted below:

The SMSNA is proud to continue its commitment to education. The highly regarded half-day **Advanced Practice Providers** program is scheduled for Thursday November 19th. Under the direction of Kenneth Mitchell and the APN/PA committee, this symposium will highlight the essentials of sexual medicine practice for mid-level providers. Content geared towards the mid-level provider will continue on Friday November 20th with the APN hands-on session. Also, on Friday, a full day for the **Cadaver Lab Residents** to learn penile implant surgery has been organized with the assistance of our industry partners. Our highly successful "trainee mixer" from the 2014 Miami meeting will be repeated Saturday the 21st. Finally, Sunday the 22nd will be dedicated in large part to resident presentations and a special session featuring established SMSNA members providing advice on **career moves** for trainees. **Residents and medical students** alike have an opportunity to win prizes and cash awards with our essay contests and awards for best abstracts (anyone within 10 years of completing their training is eligible).

The health and well-being of **war veterans** has been acknowledged as a pressing public health need. The SMSNA is proud to help contribute to the betterment of care for our veterans with a special session on sexual health and trauma; focused on the urologic/sexual health care needs of wounded warriors. This new program for social and





civic engagement represents a brave new world for the SMSNA and underscores our commitment to advancing not just science but public health advocacy.

Based on the very positive feedback we have received on our past video sessions on **sexual medicine surgery** we will feature expert led sessions on Peyronie's Disease and penile implant surgery with a focus on basic maneuvers utilized by acknowledged leaders in the field. The art of surgery is a lifelong process and there is always an opportunity to learn new "tricks of the trade" from our friends and colleagues.

This year's meeting will feature an increased emphasis on the **sexual health of women**.

We have schedule a special symposia on surgical management in women with sexual health concerns, persistent genital arousal disorder, sexuality and pregnancy/motherhood, and contraception.

We have also made an effort to incorporate content relevant to the **broad spectrum of patients that we see in our practices**. We have included content on non-normative sexual behaviors and sexuality issues in LGBT persons.

**Basic science** remains a core priority of the SMSNA; the latest breakthroughs in ED, Peyronie's, and priapism will be highlighted in dedicated state of the art presentations by world class researchers. A special symposium on neuroplasticity and its relevance to sexual function recovery after nerve damage will be of particular interest to clinicians/ researchers who address sexuality issues related to nervous system injury.

Finally, we will discuss many of the **business aspects of sexual medicine** practice that are relevant to success and patient outreach. This portion of the meeting will include content on using social media to promote one's practice and work and a session on the medico-legal fundamentals essential to good medical practice.

## **CME Information**

### **Activity Overview and Description**

The 2015 SMSNA Annual Fall Scientific meeting will promote, encourage, and support the highest standards of practice, research, education, and ethics in the study of the anatomy, physiology, pathology, diagnosis, and treatment of human sexual function and dysfunction and provide a forum for the free exchange and discussion of new ideas, thoughts, and concepts in this field.

The SMSNA seeks to identify existing and emerging issues in the field of human sexual function and dysfunction, provide accurate and credible information to medical professionals, develop standards and guidelines for sexual medicine research and practice, and produce educational programs that bring leading-edge concepts of research, clinical practice, ethics, and politics to health care professionals interested in sexual medicine and related matters.

### **Target Audience**

This educational activity will be of interest to urologists, primary care physicians, internists, cardiologists, endocrinologists, gynecologists, psychiatrists, psychologists, therapists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, residents, fellows, medical students, and researchers interested in sexual medicine.

### **Learning Objectives**

Upon completion of this activity, participants should be better able to:

- » Identify the sexual health ramifications of treatment for breast, gynecological, and testis cancer and develop strategies for management.
  - Explain the interpersonal dynamics and psychological issues common in couples being treated for prostate cancer.
- » Explain how pregnancy and parturition affects a woman's experience of her sexuality from both physical and mental perspectives.
  - Descripe how pelvic floor physical therapy may be useful in mitigating the negative effects of pregnancy on sexuality in women.
  - Discuss the current controversy on how hormonal contraception influences sexuality in women.
  - Review how currently available contraceptive options influence men's experience of sexuality.
- » Develop strategies to elicit a history of sexual violence in a sensitive and supportive environment.
  - Describe the appropriate steps in tailoring medical/psychological management to the needs of the trauma victim.
  - Explain the particular healthcare needs of male and female veterans of recent US military engagements and how sexual wellness factors into the care of these veterans.
- » Explain the importance of patient selection and careful counseling on expectations before surgery for correction of Peyronie's Disease.

Describe the various approaches to penile plication and relative advantages/risks of these approaches.

Describe the various approaches to penile patch grafting and relative advantages/risks of these approaches.

Explain the role of penile implant surgery for Peyronie's Disease and optimization of outcomes.

- Review various approaches to common steps in penile implant placement, including positioning of the patient, selection of infection prophylaxis, access to the corporal bodies, means of placing various implant components, and post-operative care.
  - Discuss best practices and alternatives will facilitate a better understanding from the attendees on how to best perform implant surgery in their particular populations.
- » Describe the unique needs of women who have experienced female genital cutting.
  - Explan the controversy surrounding female genital cosmetic procedures and appropriate utilization/counseling of women considering these.
  - Explain the importance of patient selection and meticulous surgical technique when contemplating surgical management of female sexual pain disorders.
- » Describe how off-label use of gonadotropins, selective estrogen modulators, and/or aromatase inhibitors may be useful to augment intrinsic testosterone production in men with testosterone deficiency.
  - Discuss the current state of the art with respect to testosterone testing in women.
  - Cite the off-label options for testosterone supplementation in women.

- Explain neuroplasticity and its relevance to ED and sexual medicine.
  - 2) Describe the latest information on the basic science of ED, including molecular messengers such as Sonic Hedgehog.
- » Explain the perspectives of legal professionals when reviewing medical records.
  - Learn principles of the law essential for the prevention and successful management of litigation issues.
  - Explain how social media may be used to promote clinical practices; attention to appropriate use and risk management will be emphasized.
- » Identify the links between cardiovascular disease and sexual dysfunction.
  - Develop ideas on how to incorporate a cardiovascular wellness program into their clinical or therapeutic practices.
- » Learn the basics of how to counsel and care for transgender persons.
  - Learn about health sexual expression in gay men and how to promote sexual wellness in gay men with sexual dysfunction.
  - Explain consensual power exchange and non-monogamous relationships.
  - Review data on the prevalence of "nonnormative" sexual interests.
- » Junior attendees (e.g. residents, fellow, junior faculty) will have the opportunity to interact with SMSNA members at an informal mixer.
  - Apanel discussion on selecting and negotiating a first appointment/clinical position will be presented.
  - Work by junior investigators will be highlighted in a dedicated "best of SMSNA" session.

» APN/PA will develop and understanding of the principles and practice of sexual medicine. This will include understanding the physiology and pathophysiology of ED, Peyronie's Disease, Testosterone Deficiency, female sexual dysfunction, and other related conditions.

APN/PA will develop facility and skill with common office based procedures in sexual medicine (e.g. Doppler Ultrasound, penile injections for erection function testing and/or treatment of peyronie's Disease, placement of testosterone supplementation, etc).

### **Method of Participation**


